

Sexual violence is defined as any sexual act that is imposed on another person without their consent by means of


- intimidation;

"Consent" is communicated through mutual, affirmative, and enthusiastic actions. This means consent is gained through words or actions that show an active, knowing and voluntary agreement to engage in mutually agreed-upon sexual activity.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Sexual Harassment (sexual misconduct) means behavior that is based on sex or gender stereotypes and has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with a person's academic performance, employment or equal opportunity to participate in or benefit from University programs or activities. Sexual Harassment may include, but is not limited to:

- unwelcome requests to date or to engage in a romantic relationship;
- unwelcome commentary about an individual's body or sexual activities;
- threatening to engage in the commission of a violent or sexual act with another person;
- talking or cyber-stalking;
- engaging in indecent exposure, voyeurism, or other invasion of personal privacy;
- unwelcome physical touching or closeness;
- unwelcome jokes or teasing of a sexual nature or based upon gender or sex stereotypes; and
- sexual violence.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

The University's Title IX Sexual Harassment Policy extends to educational programs or activities of the University of Kansas and extends to any retaliatory actions by an individual against an individual who has previously or may arise from participating in the Title IX resolution process.

To fall into Title IX, the action must be so Severe, Pervasive, and Objectively Offensive that it would constitute a hostile environment for the complainant with proper standing and the action must have occurred within Title IX's jurisdiction.

The University can also address sexual harassment that falls outside of Title IX jurisdiction through the University Discrimination, Complaint Resolution Process.

Stalking is engaging in an unwanted course of conduct (two or more acts) directed at a specific person that a reasonable person would cause a reasonable person to

- fear for their safety or the safety of others

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic Violence/Dating Violence are crimes of violence committed by:

- current or former spouse or intimate partner
- shares a child in common
- for a male perpetrator is a spouse or intimate partner;
- Who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim

Including:

physical abuse;
sexual abuse;
emotional abuse;
psychological abuse;
economic abuse;
coercion and threats;
intimidation;
isolation;
children; and/or
privilege

Who are Mandated Reporters?

Persons who have a special obligation to share information with the Title IX Coordinator or a public safety office.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Survivors are strongly encouraged to seek confidential medical care after an assault. Evidence collection for Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner (SANE) is available up to 120 hours after a sexual assault at no cost to the survivor. Preventative medication for sexually transmitted infections can be collected without reporting and stored for five years. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Educational presentations and trainings for students, faculty and staff on a variety of topics relating to sexual assault and intimate partner violence are available at no cost: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Consent@KU #RelationshipGoals Jayhawks Give a Flock Sex, Drugs, and Alcohol Gender-based Violence Response Violence Prevention Through Environmental Design
Reporting & Investigation	Counseling & Advocacy
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All students affected by sexual or intimate partner violence are encouraged to file reports. Police: Students have the option to provide criminal information voluntarily report. Office of Civil Rights & Title IX: Students have the option to report and/or participate in a voluntary internal campus investigation. The Office of Civil Rights & Title IX also provides interim measures for students (academic accommodations, housing location, contact information investigation). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Care Coordinator: Provides confidential and free individualized support for all students affected by sexual and domestic violence and assistance navigating campus and community resources. Intimate Partner Violence: Confidential resources including therapy, advocacy and safe shelter are available through the Care Center (Sexual Assault) and the Willow (Intimate Partner Violence). Counseling: No and low cost therapeutic resources for both acute and historical assault are available on and off campus.
